While continuing to study a broad range of subjects, students start to focus on their strengths by choosing their individual mix of subjects.

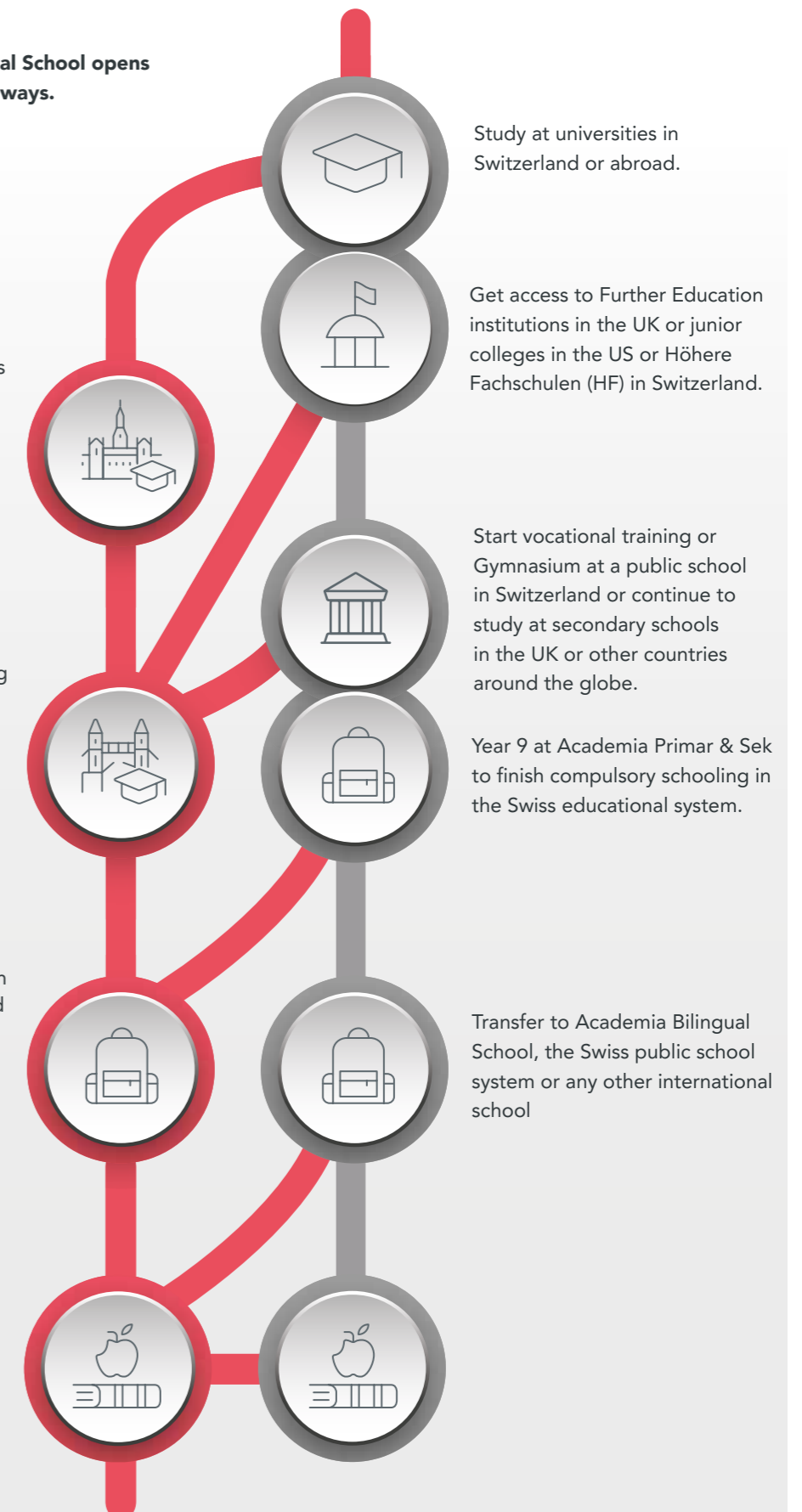
## Year 9–10 IGCSE-programme











# Kindergarten and Primary<sup>(K – Y6)</sup>

Our well qualified and highly motivated teachers make use of modern methods and didactics.











## Pre-IGCSE (Y7 & 8)

Our Pre-IGCSE-programme offers a unique curriculum blending the well-established British international curriculum with a highly innovative and unique approach to German. All academic subjects are taught in English. However, a considerable part of our teaching time is dedicated to German by layering our curriculum with project-based learning. This means that students not only attend language lessons, but also work on projects for other academic subjects, thus building a rich specialised vocabulary. Furthermore, students build the foundations in key competencies, such as critical thinking, kindness, collaboration and creativity.








## IGCSE (Y9 & 10)












## International A Level (Y11 & 12)

# Additional offers

## German Booster

For students wishing to apply to Swiss universities or simply to integrate into the community more easily we offer a Swiss university track for an additional school fee.

## German and English pathways

To ensure that our native-speaker students receive the best possible support, we conduct German and English lessons in separate classes.

## Supervised homework and study time

Supervised homework and study sessions provide students with the opportunity to complete homework with the support and guidance of a teacher who maintains a calm and focused atmosphere during these afternoon sessions.

## Arts and project based learning

We have a specialist art teacher who works closely with subject teachers to provide an extra layer to the curriculum through Art and Design so that students can express their understanding of a topic through drawing, modelling, film, drama, painting or design construction. In addition to having visible application, this concept deepens learning and allows students who learn best through doing to better access the curriculum.

# Elective and extracurricular

We offer a variety of electives and extracurricular activities for students to explore an area without the pressure of assessment.

## Duke of Edinburgh

The Duke of Edinburgh Award, which is a highly regarded international award for students, includes sport, new skill development, voluntary work and expeditions. Our students can gain the award on bronze, silver and gold level.

## Model United Nations

Model United Nations (Model UN or MUN) is an extracurricular activity in which students typically role-play delegates to the United Nations and simulate UN committees.

## Art & Design

In the past we had some amazing artists among our students: a dedicated atelier allows students interested in the Arts to explore their creativity.

## Student council

The members of our student council represent the wider student body. They can raise issues and communicate with staff. They also contribute to the school by organising games evenings, bake sales and charity events.

## Prom and event committee

In this committee, senior students learn about event management. They play a major role in planning the end of year prom and are involved in everything from deciding the prom 'theme' to ordering food.

## Sports

Regular sport promotes the ability to concentrate. We therefore offer a range of sporting activities that provide a balance to the school day. The offer varies depending on the interests of our students. In the past we offered football, basketball, yoga, karate and meditation and stretch.

## Other extracurricular activities

Our academic curriculum is complemented with educationally interesting excursions (mainly day trips). In addition, we organise annual school trips overseas and ski camp specific to particular year groups. Other electives may include music, gardening, book or cooking clubs, based on the interests of our students.

# Our staff

## Experienced and caring staff

Our qualified subject specialists come from the UK, the US, Australia and Canada; teachers for modern languages teach in their mother tongue. As an international school following an English-speaking curriculum many of our teachers have QTS (Qualified Teacher Status) and are experienced UK teachers. A high proportion are educated to Master's level and we have several examiners on staff who know the IGCSE- and A-Level-exam very well. Aside from their experience and qualifications, one of the most important attributes is a sense of care and commitment.

## Pastoral care

Our tutor team provide close care and guidance for students in every year. They are also the first point of contact for parents. The team provides

### Insight week

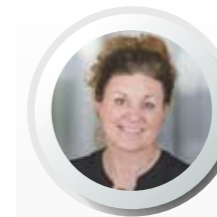
Students can register for non-binding trial days at our school.

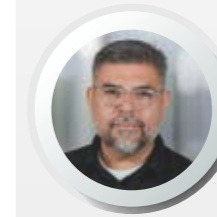
