



# Years 7 and 8

## Non-native & native German speakers

High exposure to German as a first/second language with integration of content in Project Based Learning.

#### Aim: Keep all options open while benefitting from a high quality international education.

#### At the end of Year 8 students will

- ⊘ have the option of continuing onto our upper secondary school to embark on a 4 year programme to International A Levels and obtaining an international qualification recognised by universities in Switzerland and around the world.
- have the possibility to transition over to our fully German programme in Reinach to receive focussed preparation for a vocational path and reintegration to the Swiss system.

# Years 9 to 12

## Native German speakers

Non-native speakers with a bilingual or German educational background (e.g. Years 7 and 8 at our school) may be able to take the native speaker track. This is determined by assessment.

### Aim: Prepare for university entrance in Switzerland or Germany as well as the rest of the world.

# IGCSE-programme German as a first language

The students work on the content of their first language, such as techniques of text analysis, writing various text types on a high linguistic level, developing their active vocabulary and using various complex sentence structures.

At the end of this two-year programme, students take the IGCSE German First Language exam (Cambridge).

## **Optional classes**

Native speakers can choose to join our elective Writing (extended essays) to further work on their language skills.

## **AS- and A-programme German**

As the Cambridge A/S and A-Level-exams in German test second language skills, our German native speakers have the opportunity to achieve very high results in these exams. In order to provide the most appropriate programme and feedback for our native speakers, the teaching and learning content and assessment is adapted to a native-speaking audience and is reflected in the certificates. Students are thus given every opportunity to consolidate the content learned in the two-year-IGCSE-course.

## Years 9 to 12

## Non-native German speakers

A basic level A1 of German is requested to join the standard classes which lead to the IGCSE. Booster lessons can start at A1 and at any level, as it is not dependent on regular classes.

# IGCSE-programme German as a second language

The students work on the content that provides opportunities to gain skills that will support progression to further study of German and enhance future educational or employment prospects. The topics covered are diverse and based on contexts that students are likely to encounter in their everyday life. Culturally sensitive and authentic reading and listening are used throughout.

## **AS- and A-programme German**

Our non-native speakers continue to build their language skills and prepare for their ASand A-Level exams. In order to profit the most from these language lessons classes for native and non-native speakers are separate.

## **Booster lessons German**

Our booster lessons focus solely on developing language skills (speaking, reading, writing and listening). The Booster lessons do not prepare for an academic exam, but for an optional language exam (telc A1 to C2) which is recognised by Swiss and German universities for admission purposes.

#### Please note.

If Swiss or German university is your aim we highly recommend supplementing German classes with classes at our language school and/ or taking an intensive German language holiday course during one of the school holidays. A benefit of our system compared to the IB and Swiss Matura is that you will have more time to focus on your German in the final 2 years.
